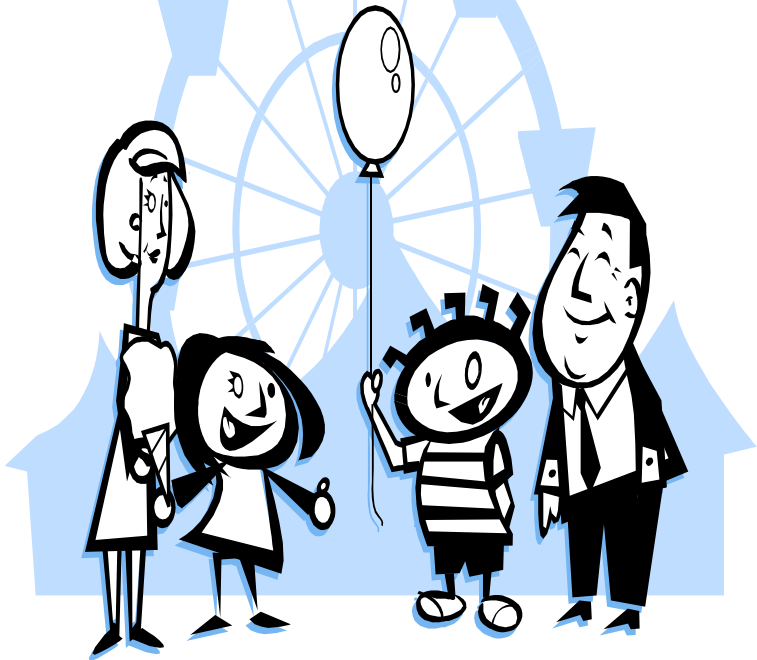

Class ----- Description

A. Ages five and under (at fair time)

- 1) My own collection of nature - mounted, max. 8 ½" x 11".
- 2) Ice cream cone decorated as a Witch's Hat.
- 3) A sponge painting of a clown - maximum 12" x 18".



- 4) Choose a picture and colour with markers.
- 5) Using 2 paper plates or cups make a musical shaker.
- 6) Make 3 vegetables out of play dough and display on a paper plate
- 7) Decorate a stone.
- 8) Make a tree using a hand print
- 9) Make a bumblebee

B. Ages six to eight (at fair time)

- 10) Decorate the word “*VEGETABLES*” using pasta and grains.
- 11) A decorated wooden clothes pin.
- 12) Hand made Mother’s Day Card.
- 13) Make a snowman using styrofoam balls.
- 14) Design or decorate an article using egg shells.
- 15) Mount and name 6 different leaves, maximum 12”x 18”.
- 16) Decorate a sneaker.
- 17) A collage of farm animals - ½ sheet of Bristol board, must be completely covered.
- 18) An article made from beads.

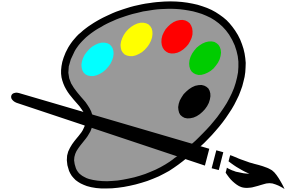
SPECIAL: Open to all children ages 8 and under

Entry Rules:

- a) **“Promoting Your Fair”** – Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
- b) Must be hand drawn.
- c) Poster size: - Minimum – 8 1/2” X 11” (23cm X 28cm), without border.
- Maximum – 11” X 17” (28cm X 44cm), without border.

- d) **Each entry must be centered on CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD exposing a 2” border on all four sides.**
- e) Name of fair, district, contact person, owner of poster and school to be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.
- f) The winning poster from each class at each fair will be eligible to enter the district competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition(see competitions at www.ontariofairs.org for details)

86) Junior Poster, youth up to and including grade 4.

- Attract and hold attention – 30 points
